I recently made some requests regarding reception of Holy Communion. These are intended to clarify and tighten-up some details, especially now that so many more people are able to be present at a single Mass at SJV. Here is a summary for those who weren't with us that weekend, and a reminder for those who were. Thanks to everyone for doing a good job adjusting their habits – it has really helped. – Fr. G

- Please do not instruct people who cannot receive communion to come forward for a blessing, since this sometimes leads to awkward moments or accidents.
- Please do not defer to others in the communion line this holds things up and causes a
 distraction.
- Please make the proscribed gesture of reverence to the Lord (a bow) while the person in front of you is receiving.
- When there is only one minister at Mass, please stand next to the person receiving (i.e., always two people side-by-side) to help expedite the distribution of holy communion. (i.e., do not hang back at the first pew level while the person in front of you receives.)
- Father encourages the reception of holy communion on the tongue (there is no longer any Covid protocol to receive on the hand). This is up to the individual.
- Father encourages the observation of the normative posture for receiving holy communion established by the bishops of our nation, namely, standing (again, this is a request).
- Please come up close to the minister as you receive, rather than standing a couple of feet away.
- Please remember to say "Amen" after the minister says, "The Body of Christ."

He is always with us. Jesus disciples the same


mission he gives to each of us: Go.


